The most sustainable holiday experiences for 2019

This week, the world's most sustainable and progressive travel organisations were revealed by the World Travel and Tourism Council (WTTC), as they listed the finalists in the 2019 Tourism for Tomorrow Awards.

Sustainable travel has really hit its stride as a new generation of travellers push it into the mainstream. In recent years, travellers have been seeking sustainable experiences in their destination choices, from increasing cultural understanding to aiding in the conservation of wildlife and choosing accommodation with serious eco credentials. Travellers have never been more aware of their impact on the places they visit and the industry is responding.

Now in its 15th year, the Tourism for Tomorrow Awards recognises the organisations with a strong commitment to sustainability. This year's finalists include The Brando in Tahiti, which has been nominated for the Climate Action Award as it gets closer to reaching its goal of being carbon neutral and self-sustainable. Shanga by Elewana Collection in Tanzania has been shortlisted for the Investing in People Award for hiring approximately 50-75% of its camp staff from the local community.



Meanwhile, small-group tour company Intrepid Travel, known for its pioneering responsible tourism strategies (such as being the first major international travel company to remove elephant rides from its tours in 2014) are among the finalists in the Social Impact Award category. Organisations fighting the illegal wildlife trade through sustainable tourism have also been recognised, including SEE Turtles in the USA (who work to protect sea turtles through ecotourism) and The Cardamom Tented Camp (who operate a conservation-friendly adventure getaway in Cambodia).

Gloria Guevara, President and CEO of WTTC, said: "I am delighted that in this 15th anniversary year, we are particularly highlighting initiatives which are combatting the illegal wildlife trade, in line with the WTTC Buenos Aires Declaration which was launched in April 2018."
